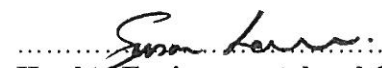

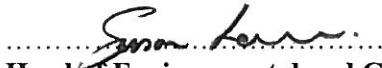

Guidance for Operators receiving the Information Notice

(This guidance does not form part of the Information Notice, but it is for the guidance of those served with the notice.)

1. Responding to an Information Notice requirement

There is a legal obligation imposed directly on all European facility operators that come within the capacity thresholds mentioned in Article 5 of the Regulation (EC) No 166/2006 concerning the establishment of a European Pollutant Release and Transfer Register (known as the E-PRTR). Each operator now has an obligation to collect information on releases and off-site transfers of pollutants and wastes from the facility, and must annually report these to their competent authority.

This notice, issued pursuant to Regulation 60(2) of the Environmental Permitting (England and Wales) Regulations 2007 requires you to supply that information in a specified format to the Council in its role as competent authority.

The [legal person/individual] named in this notice is required to supply the information detailed in the attached electronic E-PRTR Data Submission Sheet within the timescale specified. Guidance is attached on how to complete the E-PRTR Data Submission Sheet

2. Confidentiality

Under article 4(2) of Directive 2003/4/EC (public access to environmental information) and the E PRTR guidance, it is only possible to claim confidentiality in certain limited cases. If you wish to do this, you must provide detailed documentation to justify your claim. **Please note that it is not possible under the Directive to make a claim for confidentiality in terms of emissions/releases to the environment.** Further guidance on confidentiality can be found in chapter 8 of the LA-IPPC and LAPPC Guidance.

3. Offences

Failure to comply with this Information Notice is an offence under regulation 32(1)(e) of the 2007 Regulations. A person guilty of an offence under this regulation could be liable (i) on summary conviction, to a fine not exceeding the statutory maximum (currently £5000); or (ii) on conviction to a fine or imprisonment for a term not exceeding two years or both.
